

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR YOUR VISIT

WELCOME!

Admission to the zoo and all exhibits is free.

A map has been included with your information packet. Maps are also available at Gateway Pavilion (#29). Please refer to map and facility #'s for locations.

SAFETY FIRST:

One adult chaperone per ten children is required. One adult chaperone per five preschool or kindergarten children is requested. Chaperones must stay with their group at all times. Name tags with your group name, phone number and group leader's name are strongly suggested for all children. This information is needed if a child is separated from his or her group. If your group has an identifying uniform, T-shirt or hat, each person should wear it.

Please go to **Gateway Pavilion (#29)** for assistance in locating a lost child.

BUS DROP-OFF PROCEDURE:

Buses must pull a parking ticket at the Cannon Drive entrance. There is a 30-minute grace period for drop-off and pick-up without charge.

LUNCH INFORMATION:

The zoo has designated areas for groups. Picnic tables are available April 1–October 15 near the Bus Drop-off Area (#32). The covered Foreman Pavilion (#33) located south of Regenstein Small Mammal-Reptile House is open April 1–October 15. The Tadpole Room is available in the lower level of Park Place Café (#19b). Please note, space is limited.

LOCKERS:

Lockers are available at the Bus Drop-off Area (#32) for storing lunches and coolers. Please do not leave your lunches on your bus, since there is no bus parking near the zoo. Large lockers require a \$5 rental fee for a lock, as well as a driver's license or photo ID as security. Locks are available at Gateway Pavilion. Smaller lockers, which require \$1 in quarters to operate, also are available at the Bus Drop-off Area.

RESTROOMS:

Restrooms for groups are located at Park Place Pavilion (#19), the Foreman Pavilion (#33), Regenstein Small Mammal-Reptile House (#10), the Kovler Lion House* (#7), and the childrens zoo (#9).

*This house's restrooms are not accessible for people with disabilities.

AT&T ENDANGERED SPECIES CAROUSEL:

The carousel (#30) is located at the East Gate. The cost is \$2.50 per ride. Children over 42" tall may ride by themselves. A child under 42" must be accompanied by an adult. School groups purchasing rides four weeks in advance of their visit can receive \$1 off each ride. Group Sales Form is included. The carousel is open weather-permitting.

GIFT SHOPS:

Our Wild Things! Gift Shop (#22) is open daily and the Safari Shop (#23) is open April 1–October 31. The Farm-in-the-Zoo General Store (#24) is open April 1–Labor Day. Chaperones are required, food and beverages are prohibited. Please allow plenty of time to shop, an hour before you scheduled departure time is suggested. Take advantage of our three discounted Goodie Bags that are offered on the Group Sales Form.

PLEASE REMEMBER:

No inline skates, bicycle riding or ball playing is allowed anywhere on zoo grounds. For the safety of your pets and our animals, no pets are allowed on zoo grounds.

DO NOT FEED THE ANIMALS:

Zoo animals require special diets. Other foods can be harmful to their health.
